WITNESS STATEMENT

Carol GLEN

1. I am 42 years of age and I live in the state of Victoria.

Background

- In 2008, I began working for the HSU Victoria No. 1 Branch (No. 1 Branch) as an organiser.
- I was responsible for both public and private hospitals. I was not an elected official at this stage.
- 4. At that time, Mr Jeff Jackson (Mr Jackson) was the secretary of No. 1 Branch.
- In 2009, I ran in the branch election on Mr Marco Bolano's (Mr Bolano) ticket and I
 was elected as the No. 1 Branch President.
- Mr Bolano was elected as the Branch Secretary, and Mr Jamie Martorana (Mr Martorana) was elected as the Assistant Secretary.
- In the three months leading up to the election, I was mostly out canvassing votes at sites, working with delegates.
- I had no involvement in the campaign funding or financing.
- In or about September 2010, after the amalgamation, I was the Divisional Secretary in Victoria of HSU East.
- 10. The balance of the executive was made up of:
 - a) Mr Michael Williamson (Mr Williamson), the General Secretary;
 - b) Ms Kathy Jackson (Ms Jackson), the Executive President;
 - c) Mr Peter Mylan (Mr Mylan), a Divisional Secretary; and
 - d) Mr Bolano, a Divisional Secretary.

Bullying and Intimidation at HSU East

11. During the period of my employment with HSU East, I believe that I was deliberately loaded with extra work to keep me busy and out of the office.

- 12. I felt excluded from discussions after the amalgamation. It was very much a 'boys club' within the union. I felt as if I was on a "need to know basis". I felt I did not get any support from Ms Jackson.
- 13. I thought that Mr Williamson was a bully. He was very hard to work with and I believe he saw me as an easy target because I was a young and naïve female he thought he could manipulate.

Corruption in HSU East

- 14. I observed that after the amalgamation, everything in HSU East was very extravagant when it did not have to be.
- 15. We were, after all, a trade union and should not have been holding extravagant events like the Annual Convention in Sydney.
- 16. The atmosphere was not at all friendly like it had been in Victoria No. 1 Branch before the amalgamation. I did not feel that you could trust anyone.
- I observed that Mr Williamson and Ms Jackson treated people at HSU East very poorly.

My Resignation from HSU East

- 18. I refer to paragraphs 189 to 203 of Mr Marco Bolano's Statement of Evidence, dated 12 June 2014, and filed with the Royal Commission, and say as follows.
- From about September 2011, I felt increasingly uneasy in my occupation at HSU East.
- 20. I felt alone, as I had not been told anything by my colleagues, and Mr Williamson continued to intimidate me.
- 21. I attended an HSU national meeting which was held in Sydney.
- 22. Mr Bolano behaved very badly at the meeting. He was shouting at people and I observed that as officials were not allowed to speak without Ms Jackson or Mr Bolano's permission or we were seen to be siding with NSW.
- 23. I had delegates with me at the meeting and I was embarrassed to be a part of Ms Jackson and Mr Bolano's team and so I decided that enough was enough.
- 24. After the meeting I had a conversation with Mr Gerard Hayes (Mr Hayes), who was a Divisional Secretary like me.

- 25. Mr Hayes and I got on well. He was a mentor for me as I found him to be very professional, calm and knowledgeable.
- 26. On or about 30 November 2011, I informed Mr Hayes that I was contemplating resigning and he said to me words to the effect of, "Well, I understand."
- 27. Mr Hayes indicated to me that the situation within HSU East was not pleasant for the NSW officials either.
- 28. Mr Hayes said to me, "It's going to get a whole lot worse, because this is just it's not going to end well."
- 29. After I spoke to Mr Hayes, Mr Bolano came up to me and said in an intimidating way, "What were you talking to him about?"
- 30. This was the last straw for me.
- 31. I went home and decided that I was going to resign as the atmosphere within the union was affecting my health.
- 32. On the morning of my resignation, 1 December 2011, I met with Mr Mylan and Mr Hayes at a coffee shop across from the Sussex Street office in Sydney and told them that I wanted to resign.
- 33. At first, Mr Mylan and Mr Hayes made attempts to change my mind.
- 34. Mr Mylan then said to me words to the effect of, "I am sad to see you go Carol, but I understand your reasons and accept your resignation."
- 35. Mr Mylan indicated to me that my resignation would be on the same terms as Mr Jamie Martorana's (Mr Martorana) terms of settlement when he resigned.
- 36. A copy of my letter of resignation dated 1 December 2011, is annexed to this statement and marked "A".
- 37. Mr Mylan then arranged for a deed of agreement (the **Deed**) and a confidentiality agreement to be drafted, which I signed a short time after our meeting.
- 38. A copy of the Deed is annexed to this statement and marked "B".
- 39. A meeting was called at 11am, that same day, by Mr Bolano and Ms Jackson.
- 40. During the meeting, I was accused of being part of Mr Williamson's NSW team and I was heavily criticised over my resignation.

The Deed

- 41. I believe the Deed contained the same conditions as those in Mr Martorana's agreement.
- 42. The Deed was effective from 1 December 2012, and stipulated that I would receive salary payments for 12 months from that date.
- 43. Annexed to this statement and marked "C" are copies of my pay slips showing the receipt of fortnightly payments.
- 44. I received fortnightly salary payments up until the disamalgamation, after which time, an Administrator was appointed and these payments ceased.
- 45. The Administrator contacted me shortly after the disamalgamation, and I explained to him that I believed the terms in the Deed were terms which were common to other officials who had resigned.
- 46. I understood, from separate conversations I had with Mr Bolano, Ms Jackson and also with Mr Jamie Martorana that it was normal for elected officials to receive a 12 month payout where they had been elected for a specific term so as to allow them sufficient time to find another job.
- 47. In or about the time when Mr Martorana resigned, Mr Bolano said to me words to the effect of, "once you have worked for a trade union you become almost unemployable and people find it very difficult to find an employer willing to take you on."
- 48. I did not receive any other payments in connection with my resignation.

After my resignation

- 49. I knew that resigning from HSU East was going to be hard and it was horrible.
- 50. It was very disappointing for me because I had wanted to do a good job for the members.
- 51. Mr Bolano informed the media that I had received a cheque or that I was going to pick up a cheque.
- 52. I believe that Mr Bolano gleaned this information from an entry which I posted on my Facebook page on 14 November 2012, where I said that I was picking up a cheque.

53. Annexed to this statement and marked "D" is a copy of a screenshot of the relevant Facebook page dated 14 December 2011.

54. The cheque I was referring to in my Facebook entry was a cheque to pay rent.

55. Annexed to this statement and marked "E" is a copy of a Tenant Trust Ledger Report showing the payment of rent on 14 December 2011 and a related email from the Property Manager of same date.

56. I then had Mr Ean Higgins (Mr Higgins) from The Australian, and other journalists, phoning me and saying that I had done a deal with the NSW faction and that I had abandoned my Victorian colleagues to look after my own interests.

57. Newspaper articles were subsequently published making those claims.

58. Annexed to this statement and marked "F" is a copy of Mr Higgins' article published in The Australian on 11 October 2012.

59. I was insulted and upset at the time as I had always worked so hard for the union and for the members.

60. On 19 November 2012, I sent a letter to Mr Peter Punch, the solicitor for the Administrator, explaining the circumstances of my resignation.

61. Annexed to this statement and marked "G" is a copy of my letter to Mr Peter Punch.
